During the evaluation of graduation projects, there exist two important evaluation phases: Proposal Phase and Final Phase. The evaluation percentages of each phase are shown in Table 1.

PROPOSAL PHASE

Each group is expected to submit a proposal form (maximum of 1200 characters length) and make a proposal presentation (maximum 14 slides). The presentation must be 8 minutes long, and every student has to speak minimum 1.5 minutes.

In the proposal form and presentation, the following issues should be clarified by the students:

- Problem definition
- Proposed solution methodology
- Company information
- Expected results
- Project schedule plan (Project tasks and Gantt chart)

Students are expected to know:

- General characteristics of the problem on hand
- Existing parameters and variables in their problems
- Suitability of the proposed solution methodology

- General characteristics of the solution methodology
- Products/services supplied by the company
- Applicability of the proposed problem within the company
- Contributions of the graduation project to the company

The proposal form will also be graded by each committee member. If the proposal form is not submitted on time, the group will get zero from the "proposal form" criteria. Signed and scanned **proposal forms** (pdf + word files) will be submitted under the open Assignment due 8 March 2024, @17:00. Furthermore, presentations and project schedules will be uploaded to the CATS system under the open Assignments due 8 March 2024, @17:00.

The presentations that will be delivered to the jury will be scheduled for the week of March 11, and will be announced.
